



Slutredovisning av projektet Nordiska Konkurrensrättsnätverkets forskarkonferens i Stockholm hösten 2016 (dnr 405/2015)

Konkurrensverket beslutade den 29 maj 2015 att tilldela forskningsbidrag till rubricerat projekt. Bidraget uppgick till 200 000 kr.

Nordiska Konkurrensrättsnätverket är ett nätverk som är öppet för konkurrensrättsforskare i alla nordiska länder. Nätverkets målsättning är att bidra till erfarenhetsutbyte mellan konkurrensrättsforskare i de nordiska länderna. Det främsta verktyget består i att årligen samla Nordens konkurrensrättsforskare till en konkurrensrättskonferens som är öppen för alla nordiska konkurrensrättsforskare.

Den första nordiska forskarkonferensen hölls år 2004 i Stockholm och organiserades av forskare vid Stockholms universitet. Den andra konferensen hölls 2007 i Danmark och organiserades av Juridiska institutet vid Köpenhamns handelshögskola. Den tredje konferensen hölls i Oslo 2008 och organiserades av Universitetet i Oslo. Den fjärde konferensen hölls i Bergen den 31 januari till 1 februari 2011 i Bergen och anordnades av Bergens universitet. Den femte konferensen hölls i Lund den 26 och 27 april 2012 och anordnades av Lunds universitet under ledning av professor Hans Henrik Lidgard; konferensen finansierades med forskningsmedel om 200 000 kr av Konkurrensverket. Den sjätte konferensen hölls i Helsingfors den 3–4 oktober 2013 och anordnades av Helsingfors universitet. Den sjunde konferensen ägde rum i Köpenhamn den 3–4 september 2015 och anordnades av Köpenhamns universitet.

Medlen som beviljades för detta projekt blev en avgörande förutsättning för att kunna genomföra Nordiska Konkurrensrättsnätverkets forskarkonferens i Stockholm hösten 2016.

Syftet med konferensen är att göra det möjligt för konkurrensrättsforskare att mötas för att diskutera och lära av varandras erfarenheter inom konferensens ämnen samt att etablera personliga kontakter för att underlätta framtida samarbeten mellan konkurrensrättsforskare i de olika nordiska länderna. Ett ytterligare syfte med Nordiska Konkurrensrättsnätverkets forskarkonferenser är att ge unga forskare – främst doktorander – tillfälle att presentera sina forskningsprojekt för att få tips och feedback från erfarna forskare.

Finansieringen från KKV möjliggjorde i detta fall bl.a. att doktorander hade möjlighet att få ersättning för rese- och övernattningskostnader.
